Dear Parents,

As a result of rising cases in Knowsley, we decided to revisit all risk assessments for school visits to ensure they were COVID safe and not bring any additional risk into the area. All external organisations provided robust risk assessments and this week Class 1 and 2 enjoyed a lovely day out at Imagine That. Staff reported that it was very well organised, and the pupils were excellent.

This week we have had three pupils test positive; one was already at home isolating so did not come into contact with anyone from school. Two in the same bubble had to isolated along with their class and staff. Whilst we understand that self-isolation is difficult, it is necessary to stop the virus spreading. One frequently asked question is 'If a child who was in contact of a confirmed case tests negative, can they stop isolating?' Public health answer is: 'No, the child should complete 10 days of isolation.

Self-isolation has proved difficult for the school as many supply agencies do not have staff however, we have done the best we can to ensure education is not disrupted and thank you all for your patience at this difficult time.

## **Unacceptable Behaviour**

Recently, we have had a very small number of incidents where parents have behaved in an unreasonable manner in and around our school premises. These incidents have been in front of children and as Millbrook Primary School serves pupils aged 3 to 11 years old, you will all agree that the children are far too young to witness adults being verbally aggressive, swearing or being physically aggressive. We have a duty to protect everyone in our school community. School staff have the right to be protected and should not have to break up altercations between parents or have to deal with anyone who is behaving in an aggressive manner or swearing. Children have the right to feel safe coming to school and all parents should model good behaviour, so we all set the right example to our children. It is very rare that the school seeks advice from Knowsley's Legal Department over parent behaviour, but this has been the case recently. We hope all the parents that we have spoken to recently have had the opportunity to reflect and consider how they will conduct themselves in the future.

## Classes and Year Group numbers

Over the next couple of weeks, we are finalising classes for next year. This always presents a challenge as our standard number for each year group is 40 and four of our year group are full. As a result, our classes are organised in vertical grouping (mixed vear classes) and our curriculum organised class by class to ensure there is full coverage. One good example of this is Year 4, in September we have 41 children so most Year 4 will go into Class 8. Children journey through the school from Reception over seven years, with nine classes it is inevitable that they will miss two in their journey. This does not mean they have been moved up or kept down. All children are treated equally.
