COVID Update

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature. Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Adults with a positive COVID test should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days. For children, the advice is 3 days unless they are still symptomatic.
